UVA Health is committed to improving healthcare access and health equity in the communities we serve as part of our mission to "transform health and inspire hope for all Virginians and beyond." Our community health needs assessment shows that most of our patients and many area children and families are impacted by financial hardships and social determinants of health that increase the prevalence of chronic diseases, create barriers to primary and preventive care, and compromise patients' recovery from illness and injury.

# **CARE IN THE COMMUNITY**

We strive to make UVA Health's world-class care accessible to all residents of Charlottesville. With public and private support, we acquired our first **mobile health vehicle** and will begin offering mobile primary care services initially in two of Charlottesville's most underserved neighborhoods, Fifeville and Southwood. With additional philanthropic support, we can expand these services to other areas and purchase additional mobile health vehicles. UVA Health also provides healthcare and other resources to residents facing barriers to care in a traditional clinic setting through:

- The Latino Health Initiative
- Health stations in Fifeville and Southwood
- Nursing clinic at the Westhaven CARES Center
- Consultation and care services for the homeless
- International Family Medical Clinic for refugees

# **CARE BEYOND MEDICINE**

We assist patients and community members in meeting basic needs.

- Our BEYOND Program helps patients and their families struggling to secure lodging, transportation, utilities, or other basic needs during treatment or recovery.
- Our Food Programs offer nutritious foods, nutritional education, low-cost recipes, meal cards, and other support to patients and community members facing food insecurity. These food programs draw attendance to and are vital to the success of our community health stations.

# **CARE BEYOND HOSPITAL WALLS**

We meet patients where they are to improve their care experiences and outcomes.

- Virginia at Home is UVA Health's flagship, person-centered primary care program for older adults with complex conditions or needs who are confined to their residences or assisted living facilities.
- Community Paramedicine Program helps vulnerable patients adhere to their care plans and avoid the
  Emergency Department for non-urgent needs. Through at-home visits, UVA Health paramedics assist
  patients with their medications, help them access primary and specialty care, and connect them with
  food, transportation, and other resources.
